Mix I cup of dishwashing soap into 10 cups of water. Stir gently to mix the soap and water. Non-Ultra Joy or Non-Ultra lvory dishwashing soap work the best . Remember not to taste or drink the bubble solution or get it in your eyes.



Make a "Bubble Window" for Incredible Bubbles



Materials: two straight drinking straws, 42" of yarn or string, ruler and scissors

Insert the string or yarn through both straws. Place the yarn and straws on a table.

Arrange the straws to make a rectangle. The top and bottom yarn sections should each be 14" wide.

Carefully tie the string ends so you have a rectangle with the straws 14" apart. Tie two more tight knots in the same place as the first knot.

Trim the excess string and pull the knot inside one of the straws.

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
